



Master of Christian Ministries Degree

Master of Christian Ministries Graduation rate: At its 2016 Commencement, Milligan College conferred 4 Master of Christian Ministries degrees (2015, 12; 2014, 1, 2013, N/A).

Retention/Completion Rate: Based on a 2012 MCMIn incoming class of 18 students, the number of students completing their MCMIn degree within four years was 11 (61%). Of MCMIn students entering in 2012 who did not graduate with a MCMIn degree, 1 switched and completed another seminary degree, and 6 are no longer attending.

As a new program only in its second year of graduating students, the Master of Christian Ministries degree is developing more comprehensive instruments for measuring educational effectiveness. MCMIn students have begun evaluation on a yearly basis as described below.
